

2025 ANNUAL MEAT PROJECT: You will find an offering envelope for the 2025 Meat Project in this newsletter. This is the 50th year for this project of the Central Pennsylvania World Hunger Association. The money collected will be used to purchase some of the 30,000 pounds of turkey and chicken to be processed this year on February 10-15. Ten percent of the cans are reserved for local distribution through 18 different agencies.

From the Archives... by Gary W. Parks

My latest project involves the arranging of materials relating to memorial services of congregational members. These materials include the memorial programs, obituaries, or individual records kept by the minister or funeral home. Over seven hundred congregational members are represented. Most of the records date from the 1970s forward. Sadly, so many of the names are familiar names, recent losses. The records are arranged alphabetically in a series of notebooks. Oversized programs are housed in a separate box. One program is probably the earliest that I have come across: "A Service To The Memory of Pvt. Donnal L. Ritter Vespers-April 15, 1945... Rev. V.D. Naugle, Pastor."

The program indicates that the Memorial Service was "held in memory of Pvt. Donnal L. Ritter, who died in the service of our country in the battle of the Philippines- killed in action on December 17, 1944." His biographical sketch is included "Donnal L. Ritter, son the late Ernest L. Ritter and his wife, Mrs. Florence Ritter. He was born May 15, 1923 at Renova (SIC), Pa. and baptized in Zion's Lutheran Church of Renova at the age of six months. The family later moved to Lewisburg where he attended the Sunday School of Christ's Evangelical Lutheran Church, and the public schools of Lewisburg.

Private Ritter entered the service of his country, January 29, 1943, and was assigned to the 24th Calvary Reconnaissance Troop at Fort Riley, Kansas. He received thirteen weeks of basic training there, after which he was sent to the Pacific war theatre. He was with his company in Hawaii, Australia, New Guinea, and in the conquest of the Philippines where he was killed in action on the Island of Leyte, December 17, 1944, at the age of 21 years, 7 months, and 2 days."

The program concluded with the Sounding of Taps by his nephew Richard Lee Derr. According to other records, his name is recorded on the Tablets of the Missing in the Manila American Cemetery, Manila, Philippines. Posthumously, he was awarded the Bronze Star and the Purple Heart. His parents and siblings are buried in the Lewisburg Cemetery.

ANNUAL SOUP AND BREAD SALE – The youth will be selling soup and bread again this year to raise funds for their mission trip to Toledo Ohio. Cost for a quart is \$8.00 and a pint is \$5.00. If you buy two quarts you get a deal at \$15.00. The flavors of bread are white, sourdough, and Italian herb.
