Dear Christ's Lutheran,

While I have previously stated that Advent is my favorite season of the church, I have to share that the season of Lent is a close second—perhaps even a tie! Lent, the dreaded season of the church. I think many of us tend to experience these forty days, these six weeks as incredibly drawn out and at times seemingly never-ending. As a child, my parents were fairly insistent on mine and my sisters' participation in giving up something for the season. Often it was dessert or chocolate or soda. My attempts at trying to give up homework were laughed at and I was told that it did not meet whatever Lenten criteria there was of giving up something that I really liked and would actually miss.

Lent is the very solemn season where we resist small temptations in our lives in a pale imitation of Christ's time in the wilderness. It's why we throw a big celebration on Tuesday, eating pancakes, indulging ourselves, before Ash Wednesday where we begin the Lenten season. Where we are reminded of our mortality, of being returned to dust, and are given the explicit reminder and invitation of the season "I invite you, therefore, to the discipline of Lent—self-examination and repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving and works of love—strengthened by the gifts of word and sacrament."

We hear this invitation to self-examination and repentance, and I think we tend to recoil a bit. Repentance often feels like a dirty word, shameful almost, and while it's a year-round call for us, this season highlights it especially. To repent is *not* to feel miserable and wallow in our sinfulness or sit in the regrets that we are not as attuned to our faith as we could be, to repent is to turn our hearts and our minds *to God*. The practice of giving something up for Lent is to help us let go of things that have distracted us from God, to remove the things that pull us away from full relationship. During this season, we are intentionally creating space in our lives to examine our relationship with God and with others. We are intentionally returning our hearts to our gracious Lord.

As we journey together through Lent, let us heed Joel's call to return to the Lord with all our hearts. Let us use this season to examine our lives, to repent of our sins, and to draw closer to the One who is merciful and loving. May this time of reflection lead us to a deeper appreciation for the ultimate act of grace—Jesus Christ's sacrifice on the cross for the forgiveness of our sins. In Christ, we are forgiven, and we are renewed.

From the Archives Mary Himmelreich Nogel Memorial Library by Gary W. Parks

The Church Archives contains the "Catalogue of the Mary Himmelreich Nogel Memorial Library, Christ's Evangelical Lutheran Church, Lewisburg, PA., Founded 1904." The listing was written in 1904, but updated in 1914, containing a listing of books #100 through #1675". Most of the books relate to Biblical history and theological thought, dating from the latter decades of the 19th century and the early 1900s. The books are alphabetically listed by author. The Library became the Church Lending Library and books were loaned out on a weekly basis with the name of the borrower, the title of the book and the dates when borrowed and returned.

There are a number of volumes which record the loans. Dates of the volumes are: September 4, 1904- August 11, 1907; August 18, 1907- December 26, 1909; January 23, 1910- April 13, 1913, September 14,1913- March 29, 1914; April 12 [1914]- September 4, 1921; September 11,1921- March 31, 1924; [volume(s) not located?]; September 10, 1933- March 27, 1938; April 3, 1938- March 8. 1942; [volume not located?]; January 4, 1944- November 20, 1947; April 6, 1947- September 8, 1957.

Many of the books from the Nogel Memorial Library are still within the holdings of the Church Archives.



Mary Himmelreich Nogel was born 21 September, 1826, the daughter of Peter (1791-1866) and Elizabeth Charles (1808-1867) Himmelreich, Jr. She married William Nogel (1822-1893) and four children were born to the union: Edwin "Clarence", John, an infant, and James Andrew. Mary's parents are buried at Driesbach Church cemetery, Mary died 17 January, 1864. Mary and her husband and two of her children are buried at the Lewisburg Cemetery. Two sons are buried in the Mazeppa Union Cemetery. At this writing, it is not certain what prompted the formation of the library.


Easter Flowers & Palm Plant Order Form—2025
