Shower us with your Spirit, and renew our lives with your forgiveness, grace, and love.

Thanksgiving for Baptism, ELW p.97

Dear Christ's Lutheran,

One of the things I love in the season of Easter is our celebration of baptism and the Thanksgiving for Baptism we use. Baptism is one of two sacraments that we hold in the Lutheran church, the other being the Eucharist. Sacraments have three key elements that define them as such: 1) a sacrament is something that Jesus commanded us to do; 2) uses a physical element that comes from the earth; and 3) is connected to God's promise of faith. Both Holy Communion and Baptism are foundational to our faith as expressions of relationship with God and with one another. Baptism is not merely a symbolic act or a rite of passage but is a means of grace through which God forgives our sins, grants us new life, and brings us into the community of faith!

In Baptism, by water and Word, we are freed from sin and death and made anew as children of God. In Romans, Paul emphasizes the death of the old and the making of the new: "³ Or don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴ We were therefore buried with him through Baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life" (Romans 6:3-4). To Paul, Baptism is the breathing (or washing) of new life and that in order for this new life to be had, we must also die. While Paul makes the connection to death, Luke calls it forgiveness of sins and 1 Peter views it as new birth: "For you have been born again, not of perishable seed, but of imperishable, through the living and enduring word of God" (1 Peter 1:23). These words from scripture direct us to understand that we are fundamentally changed and reformed by God and through God! Baptism is dying and rising again to new life every single day.

Martin Luther once said that Baptism is something we "return to daily". Every day we remember that we are baptized children of God and regardless of what we face in life, we are assured of God's unshakeable promise and gift of grace. Throughout this Easter season, take time to reflect on your own baptism. Recall the words that were spoken over you, words that tell us *who* we are and *whose* we are—"Child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever!" Whether you were baptized many years ago or recently, Easter reminds us that God's grace is always alive and always at work within us. Alleluia! Christ is risen—and in Him, we rise too. Thanks be to God for the gift of baptism and the new life it brings!




DAY OF PENTECOST RED GERANIUM ORDER FORM 2025
