Dear Christ's Lutheran,

As we enter into the month of October, the days are growing shorter, the air is becoming crisp, and the earth begins to rest in preparation for winter. This is also the season when we in the church often turn our attention to stewardship—not just as a fundraising campaign, but as a faithful way of life. Too often, we reduce the conversation around stewardship to money and lose sight of what stewardship really is. It's not just programming, or a four-week church series, it's a dutiful and intentional practice.

The word "stewardship" comes from the idea of being a caretaker. Everything we have—our time, talents, treasure, and even our capacity for thanksgiving—comes from God and is meant to be used for God's purposes. Stewardship is about how we care for these gifts that God has entrusted to us. It is our response to God's generosity. As we wrap up our "Gifted Stewards" series, I encourage you to continue to reflect on these four areas: time, talent, treasure, and thanks.

- 1. **Time**—How we use our time says a great deal about our priorities. Are we making time for worship, rest, prayer, and service? Can we create space in our schedules to be present with others—to listen, to care, and to serve?
- 2. **Talent**—Each of us has been uniquely gifted by God with skills, passions, and experiences. Good stewardship means offering those gifts in service to others and to the church. Whether it's singing in the choir, fixing what's broken, teaching, baking, organizing, or simply being a kind and steady presence—your gifts matter.
- 3. **Treasure**—Financial stewardship is a tangible way we participate in God's mission. Our giving supports the ministry of our congregation—worship, outreach, education, care for our building, and support for ministries in our community. Giving isn't just about meeting a budget—it's about aligning our resources with our values.
- 4. **Thanks**—Thanksgiving is an act of stewardship. When we practice gratitude, we become more aware of God's presence and provision in our lives. Gratitude grounds us, softens us, and opens us to generosity. This season, how might you intentionally practice giving thanks—not just on one Thursday in November, but every day? A thankful heart is a generous heart.

As we move through this season, I encourage you to pray and reflect on how God is calling you to grow as a steward of God's gifts. Stewardship is not about obligation—it's about invitation: to grow, to give, and to participate in the abundant life God intends for us and for the world. God has richly blessed us, not for our own comfort, but so we can be a blessing to others. So let us be good stewards together—joyfully, faithfully, and with thanksgiving.

We will also accept cash/checks or gift cards to purchase perishables such as cheese, margarine, eggs, milk, bread & meat.




















