Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us.

Hebrews 12:1

Dear Christ's Lutheran,

All Saint's is perhaps one of the most profound and beautiful observances in the church year. It is a day marked by both solemnity and by joy. It serves as a sacred pause where we remember the faithful who have gone before us, yet we rejoice knowing that they rest in the eternal presence of God. The author of Hebrews reminds us that these saints, this great cloud of witnesses, are not distant memories, but are present companions in the life of faith.

The image of a "cloud of witnesses" is rich with meaning. It reminds us that we are not alone in our struggles or our journey. The saints who have endured the trials of life, clung to Christ in faith, and now rest in God's grace, surround us. They cheer us on. They remind us that the race is worth running and that the finish line is not death but is resurrection.

The observance of All Saints' dates back to the early centuries of the church. Originally, this day was to honor martyrs who had died for their faith. By the 9th century, the Western Church had established November 1st as the official day of remembrance. In the Lutheran tradition, All Saints' Day is a time to reflect not only on the heroic figures of church history but also on loved ones who lived in faith and now rest in Christ.

On All Saints' Sunday, we give thanks for these witnesses: for martyrs who stood firm in the face of persecution, for reformers who upheld the Gospel, for grandparents who quietly passed on the faith, and for all who lived in Christ and now rest in our Lord. We name them. We give thanks for them. We are shaped by their example and we find ourselves encouraged by their faith.

This day can be a day of great solemnity. We are reminded of the ways that death has touched all of us. We mourn the ones that we have lost. We carry a grief that can be so persistent. In our service, the names of our departed are read aloud, we light candles for many, and perhaps tears are shed. However, this mourning is not without hope. It is a sorrow that is holy, wrapped and carried in the promise of the resurrection. There is joyful hope to hold in tension with our mourning. We celebrate that death does not have the final word! In Christ, the grave is not the end. The saints in glory now know fully what we can only glimpse by faith—perfect communion with God, free from sin, sorrow, and pain.

On this day, we name our grief and give thanks. We light candles for those we've lost, trusting that they are held in the eternal mercy of God. We remember the newly baptized among us, rejoicing in the new life we share in Christ. Life and death, sorrow and joy—all held together in the embrace of the crucified and risen Jesus.

So, I invite you to bring your whole heart to this holy day. If you are mourning a loved one, come and let the community hold space for your sorrow. If you are celebrating a new life in your family, come and rejoice with us. And if you're feeling both at once, you're not alone—All Saints' reminds us that our faith holds room for the full range of human experience, always grounded in God's faithfulness.

As we gather at the table, where heaven meets earth, and we remember all the saints and give thanks for them—for the saints we miss, the saints around us, and the saints yet to come. May you be filled with hope, comfort, and renewed strength to lay aside every burden and run the race that is set before you. Thanks be to God, who makes us one with all the saints in light.
